SPCA Area Committee – Cllr. Mrs McPherson reported on a recent meeting of this Committee where items covered included provision of grit bins, withdrawal of rural bus services and refuse collection.

Report from Highways Group (previously circulated) – Additional updates to some of the items was given as follows:

Grass verges – the County Council are to prepare a plan for possible planting of trees on parts of Grindley Lane

Parking on Hilderstone Level – double yellow lines could be considered but the parish council would need to make a case and consideration would then be given on the merits and priority for such action. It is therefore likely to be a very long term solution.

Birch Grove – the County Council would consider providing a lighting column, however the Parish council would need to foot the bill,

Community Speedwatch – the police have indicated that a minimum of 6 volunteers are needed for the training to go ahead (the 2 people expressing an interest have been informed)

Gypsy site – latest reply from the Borough Council was relayed to the meeting. **Spot Acre site (old nursery)** – response from the County Council was given to the meeting

Distribution of leaflet for Rotary in Parish Newsletter – it was agreed that this would not go out with the Newsletter
